Re: Request for Full Pardons for Twelve (12) January 6 Defendants

Dear President Donald J. Trump,

I write to you with respect for the Office of the Presidency and for your constitutional authority to grant clemency in the interest of justice, fairness, and national reconciliation.

As part of the **No Man Left Behind Campaign**, I respectfully request that you issue **full and unconditional pardons** for twelve January 6 defendants whose sentences were **commuted on January 20, 2025**, but who remain convicted felons despite extraordinary circumstances warranting complete relief.

All twelve were accused of **sedition conspiracy**, pleaded **NOT GUILTY**, refused plea deals, and exercised their constitutional right to trial—despite facing the threat of life imprisonment. They stood on principle, accepted the risk, went to trial, and were imprisoned. While their sentences were later commuted, the convictions—and their lifelong consequences—remain.

A commutation ends incarceration; it does **not** restore liberty, reputation, civil rights, or the ability to fully reenter American life. These individuals continue to suffer permanent penalties—loss of employment opportunities, voting restrictions, social stigma, and financial hardship—after already serving years behind bars.

A **full pardon** would:

- Restore civil rights and human dignity
- Correct punishment that continues beyond its justified scope
- Affirm that Americans are not punished more severely for refusing coerced plea deals
- Demonstrate that constitutional rights—including the right to trial—still matter.

The presidential pardon power exists for moments exactly like this—when justice requires closure, not permanence; resolution, not endless penalty. History will judge leaders not only by the laws they enforced, but by whether mercy and fairness were applied when punishment no longer served the public good.

I respectfully urge you to grant **full pardons** to these twelve individuals and bring final resolution to their cases.

Thank you for your consideration and for your continued commitment to the Constitution and the American people.
